Dear Praying Friends & Family,

Because my computer died suddenly, my letterhead and mailing list are lost on the hard drive and I don't have access to them. Bro. Foster said they have an old mailing list at the church, so we will be using that. If you know of someone who usually gets my prayer letters, but didn't get one this time, please have them contact me via email or contact the church and someone will send them a copy. I'm sorry for the trouble and the delay. Hopefully we will have this sorted out by my next payer letter.

Time With Family

When I returned from Thailand, I spent a few weeks in Amarillo with my home church. It was a joy to spend time with church family. I am so blessed to have a church who greatly loves me and takes good care of me.

After a few weeks in Texas, I flew to Kentucky to spend some time with family. My parents had their 40th Anniversary this year. We celebrated with family, friends, and their church family. It was a grand time as we rejoiced in their faithfulness to each other and to the Lord.

During that trip, I was able to spend time with my brother and two sisters and their families. I also had the privilege of reporting to a couple of churches in the area about what God had done for us in Thailand.

Back To Work

I am now in Ft. Worth with the Gaudets again. I need to get my computer fixed (Lord willing) and do some computer work here for Bro. Tom. I enjoyed my time with family and now I'm glad to be back to work.

What's Next?

The Gaudets are busy making plans to return to Thailand. Hopefully they will have a date set to return by the time this letter goes out. Please pray as many decisions and preparations need to be made before their trip.

Yes, you read the last paragraph right. *They* will be returning to Thailand soon. I will not be returning with them. No, they have not gotten tired of me and kicked me off the Team. (At least, I hope that's not the case!) We are just making a few changes.

For some time we have needed an office in the States as well as someone on the Field. We've never been able to have that since there has not been anyone here to run it. A few weeks ago, Bro. Gaudet asked me to pray about remaining in the States to set up and run this office.

How Will This Change Things?

I will be doing exactly the same work I've done for the past seven and a half years. I will just be doing it here in Ft. Worth instead of overseas. I will continue typesetting, research, web design, and all the other daily tasks we do in this work.

Working and living here in the States will probably make it necessary for me to get a part-time job. My support is enough to live on overseas where it is inexpensive, but not enough for living here in the States. Please pray God will provide the job that is right for me. I will need to have enough time to do all the ministry work, yet enough income to live on here. I've been in this ministry for almost eight years and my God has never failed to take care of me. I know He will provide now as well. Please pray as I deal with housing, transportation, and all the details of resettling in the States.

Since I will be working in Fort Worth this year, I have gotten a post office box here. My address is in the letterhead. My email is the same as before.

Thank each of you for your prayers on my behalf. The coming changes are exciting and overwhelming. I'm thankful that I can sing and pray as the Psalmist, "*Hear my cry, O God; attend unto my prayer. ²From the end of the earth will I cry unto thee, when my heart is overwhelmed: lead me to the rock that is higher than I. ³For thou hast been a shelter for me, and a strong tower from the enemy. ⁴I will abide in thy tabernacle for ever: I will trust in the covert of thy wings. Selah.*" (Psalm 61:1-4) Like the Psalmist, I know He will hear and answer.
